

## National guidelines – SINGAPORE

In order to comply with national requirements, we are implementing the following further precautionary measures:

Travel	No employees or delegates must enter MSTS facilities returning from affected areas defined by Ministry of Health within two weeks upon return.
Quarantine	If any of our employees'/ delegates co-habitants, such as spouse and
	children, are placed in quarantine by the authorities, irrespective of the
	reason or background, then the relevant employee/ delegate must also be
	quarantined from MSTS locations for the same period or a minimum of two
	weeks.
Social	We are complying with the national guidance on keeping 1 metre social
distancing	distance and the maximum number of people gathering as 10.
Food hygiene	Served in wrapped portions or by one person.
Class sizes	We reduce the number of delegates in classes to accommodate the 1 metre
	social distance and if required provide theoretical teaching through webinars.
Restrictions on	First Aid practical courses are transferred into individual exercises as much
courses/	as possible or demonstrations.
methodology/	All training (both theoretical and practical) are designed to accommodate 1
equipment	metre social distancing.
Cleaning of	We are complying with the national guidelines and the guidelines from the
equipment	manufacturer to ensure all equipment are sanitised and free of pathogens.
Other national	Everyone must wear a mask when outside of their homes. This applies on
specific	public transport, taxis, private hire cars, walking to or at markets, and also for
guidelines	permitted enterprise workers at all workplace premises, whether they are
	frontline staff (such as food handlers, cashiers and bus drivers) or performing
	back office functions (such as data entry personnel and payroll executives).
	Individuals may remove their mask while engaging in strenuous exercise
	outdoors (e.g. running/ jogging), but they must put it back on after completing
	exercise. A safe management measure at work place must be implemented
